





- Suggest to improve transport system.






- Take serious action about students scholarship rejection 2016-17...




Fig no.1 Analysis of Alumni Feedback for Syllabus




Fig no.2 Analysis of Students Feedback for Syllabus




Fig no.3 Analysis of Parents Feedback for Syllabus

Civil Engineering Department Faculty also Participated and registered their Opinion, so These response were analyzed and resulting analysis is shown in Fig.4






Fig no.4 Analysis of Faculty Feedback for Syllabus
